Church Reflection, News & Events

REFLECTION

One of the delights of being the owner of a one-year-old dog is watching her sheer exuberance when we get to a field and I let her off the lead. At an hour when I feel barely awake, she charges off like a racehorse, gambolling around in her newfound freedom and joie de vivre. She's helped me reflect about freedom.

I remember the lasting impression of the film *Cry Freedom* back in the 1980s; it told the story of the anti-apartheid struggle through the eyes of journalist, Donald Woods, and the freedom campaigner Steve Biko. In his visit to London just last year, Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky presented the Speaker with a pilot's helmet bearing the words "*We have freedom*. *Give us wings to protect it*." Unfortunately, all over the world, most of the time, freedom has been under threat.

But it's a complicated idea, freedom. When, for example, does my right to freedom of speech endanger your right to be safe? Or my freedom to play my music infringe on your peaceful afternoon? Our "freedom" to burn fossil fuels in the developed world over the last century or two is now threatening the freedom to their way of life for various groups of people across the planet. We've watched with horror as the freedom we have given ourselves to access anything at all on our phones, has resulted in mental health problems, often severe, in our children and young people.

In 1941 President Roosevelt talked about freedom of speech, freedom to worship, freedom from want and freedom from fear. In our communities we are fortunate that we have the first two, most of us have the third – but what about freedom *from fear*? Is that possible in an increasingly complex and threatening world?

The good news of Easter is that Jesus, through his life, death and resurrection, has made true freedom possible. St. Paul declares, "It is for freedom that Christ has set us free!". The empty tomb on Easter Sunday shows emphatically that death could not enslave Jesus. So, God has, at infinite cost, made true freedom a reality as we follow the risen Christ, free of guilt and with his mandate to challenge any form of enslavement - personal or social. One translation of Psalm 119 contains the phrase: "I run in the path of your commandments, for you have set my heart free." That takes me back to my dog — watching her running reminds me that I only find true freedom as I follow the way of Jesus.

O God, the author of peace and lover of concord, to know you is eternal life and to serve you is perfect freedom.

Christ is risen! Happy – and free – Easter!

ST LAWRENCE ROOF PROJECT UPDATE

At last, the scaffolding is gone and Phase 1 of the re-roofing of the church has been completed.

The good news is that we have reached this point on budget and on time. Our grateful thanks go to West Country Tiling, our Architects Chedburn and Codd and all who have contributed financially to this once in a lifetime project. Particular mention must, as always, be made of the Richard Oatley Foundation, without whose support this simply could not have happened.



We are now obliged to let the bats do whatever bats do in the church during the summer, but Phase 2 of the project has been out to tender and we hope to be able to make progress with that later in the year. Phase 2 is the North side of the Nave plus the North Aisle and the Porch. The final phase will be the Chancel and the Vestry.

As with all old buildings, it is difficult to predict what the final cost is going to be. The current best estimate is £444,000, with around 90% of the funding in place.

RODE BUS TIMES CHANGE FROM APRIL 7TH

A new Rode bus timetable will arrive through your letterbox ahead of the April 7th bus timetable changes. This new Rode bus timetable has been produced by Rode Parish Council and is being delivered by Rode Councillors.



Changes to the Frome/Bath D2 are being made to improve the efficiency and punctuality of the D2 service that goes via Rode. The Frome/Trowbridge X34 is currently running well so there will be no changes this April.

Unlike most villages in Somerset, we have buses 7 days a week (even on Saturday and Sunday) and from early morning until after 11 o'clock at night. Ideal for having a night out ... no worries about parking and, more importantly, no worries about having the odd drink or two when you're coming back by bus.

Plus, it's only £2 ... free if you've got a Senior Card.

We do need to use our now excellent Rode bus service more. We have been told by First Bus that the revenue they're currently earn from their D2 coming via Rode is not covering the costs of coming through Rode. First have warned that unless there is an increase in passenger numbers from Rode, cuts may have to be made to the service at the September timetable review. It is especially at weekends where the number of Rode folk getting the D2 is a problem.

So we invite you (ask even!) that if you normally go to Frome or Bath by car, you think whether at least on some occasions you could leave your car behind and 'Bus It".

By going by bus more often, you could be ensuring that buses continue to come via Rode which is so important for all those in our village who may not have access to a car. It's often the young and the old who are entirely dependent on travelling by bus.

If you can 'Bus It' more often, that will help all those in Rode who have to rely on going by bus.

CLIMATE EMERGENCY UPDATE

Proposed Solar Farm

Rode Parish Council recently made an additional submission to Somerset Council, as part of the re-consultation exercise that concluded in mid-March.

Although the PC is strongly in favour of sustainable energy and formally declared a Climate Emergency in 2021, in line with the views of many local residents, the council believes this proposed development is flawed in multiple ways. In particular the PC is concerned about the scale of the proposed solar farm (which would be the largest in Somerset, and one of the largest in the UK), its proximity to the village, and its impact on the local countryside and a number of heritage assets.

The PC believed that the changes made to the scheme since the original consultation period were very minor in nature and did not materially address any of the concerns or issues previously raised.

The application will now be considered at the May meeting of the Somerset East Planning Committee, on 7th May.

As I type excitement is building for next week's Design Technology project 'The Great Big Mini-Egg Challenge'!





RODE AND DISTRICT GARDEN CLUB

48th Annual General Meeting of Rode and District Gardening Club

The Chairman highlighted how successful 2023 had been for the Club, with its mixture of garden visits in the warmer, lighter months and talks in the late Autumn and Winter. She thanked the committee for their hard work and

support. Two committee members have resigned; thanks were expressed to Peter Simper, and to Margaret Clark, who is stepping down as our president. Her long service to the Club and the committee was marked with a bouquet and gift. Volunteers were sought to join the committee and share the workload. After the meeting Sari Gilbert was persuaded to take on the role of president.



The treasurer reported increased membership in 2023, which increased income. However, the increased costs of the coach trip and speaker fees meant there was a small loss of £25. This can easily be covered by reserves and in 2024 a proposed plant sale and monthly raffle ticket sales could offset this, so membership fees will not be increased.

We then welcomed Gill Hazell to talk about Classic and Unusual Bulbs. In 1967 Gill and her husband moved to Somerset where they began entering Sutton Show. Through showing they got interested in gladioli and ordered new varieties every year. When the grower advised them, he was going to retire they decided to buy the business. They discovered he not only imported gladioli but also many unusual bulbs to sew in the Autumn. This led them to travelling regularly to Holland to see new and exciting flowering bulbs. She was fascinated to discover the wide range of types of tulips, narcissi and hyacinths available since the introduction of the tulip for gardeners in 1600.

She talked knowledgably about a wide range of lesser-known bulbs, illustrating their size and colour ranges. Most can be safely grown outdoors here, but some need the protection of an unheated greenhouse. There were almost too many to choose from, but many will be planning to chase those that really appealed. Sadly, since Brexit it has become too expensive to import smaller amounts from Europe, so she no longer sells corms and bulbs. Other smaller, specialised companies are also ceasing to trade, so finding them could become more difficult.

This month will be the last one in the village hall for some months. Our speaker will be Carrie Pakenham, who will talk about herbs their cultivation and use on Monday 8th April. Guests are always welcome. Members are invited to bring any spare plants to sell.

This month there is also a willow workshop in Rode Village Hall on Thursday 11th April, 10am -1pm, to make an obelisk for the garden. The cost is £29, which includes all the materials required and refreshments. There are just a few spaces left. Contact the club to book a place.



MINUTES OF MEETING OF RODE PARISH COUNCIL HELD IN RODE MEMORIAL HALL ON 11th MARCH 2024 AT 7.30 pm

UNCONFIRMED

Present:

Cllr Andy Pickett (AP) – in the Chair, Cllr Ann Edney (AE), Cllr Jonathan Bowler (JB), Cllr Pat Restorick (PR), Cllr Moira Punt (MP), Cllr Peter Travis (PT) and Cllr Jim McAuliffe (JM).

In attendance: Hugh Williams – Clerk and 6 Parishioners

- **1. Parishioners Participation:** All present had come for item on new village hall, so this item was moved up the agenda.
- **2. Apologies for absence**: Cllr M Salmon and Cllr D Denton and Cllr A Boyden (County Councillors).
- **3. Approval of the minutes**: The minutes of the Parish Council meeting held on 12th February were approved.
- 4. Declarations of interest: None.

5. Community Hall:

There was enthusiasm to progress the project to develop plans for a new village hall to be located on the playing field site. However, members of the Committee working on the project were concerned that there were no terms of reference for the Committee and also there could be problems over liability which the Committee members could face once any contracts were entered into. Members were seeking the Parish Council (PC) take a lead in this and to provide an independent Chair for the Committee.

Discussions centred on how the PC could help and draw up terms of reference along with stages through which the project should progress. It was also important that liability was covered so no member of the Committee become liable and therefore documentation needs to be drawn up to protect members of the Committee.

It was confirmed that the aim was to keep the current Memorial Hall operational until the new one was ready.

It was reported that an outline draft for the new building and site should be available shortly.

AP requested the PC to vote whether it was in favour of the project progressing and desiring to assist in it. The meeting voted in favour by majority. It was agreed that the Parish Council members should meet with the current Committee to

agree a way forward for the project. (Dates of 27 or 28 March or 8 April were agreed for meeting.)

6. Actions from previous meeting:

i. Autospeedwatch: John Flindall reported that the new device was now fitted on Bradford Road and it recorded both vehicle number plates and speed. The PC will need to pay the annual fee each year to ensure data are still recorded. Repeat offenders are contacted by the police. The co-ordinator is subject to confidentiality and privacy requirements. He reported that in the first 4 days of operation 400 vehicles had been recorded as exceeding 40mph in the 30mph zone. This device really had to remain in a fixed location, however the other SID can be moved to the other agreed locations. The Autospeedwatch device did not give speeds to motorists so did not act as a way of getting motorists to slow down. It would be investigated whether the two devices could be located on the same pole as they might interact with each other.

A new Community Speed Watch co-ordinator was required for Rode following Malcolm Wood's retirement. The meeting thanked Malcolm Wood for his work as co-ordinator and agreed to give a gift to him.

- **ii. Bench at top of Marsh Road:** The current bench is broken and considered beyond repair. John Osborne was present at the meeting and agreed to purchase and install a new bench and transfer the dedication. The meeting thanked him for his help and agreed to reimburse him.
- **iii. Paths at playing field:** The new path had yet to be installed due to the continuing wet weather. It was hoped it could be done this month.
- **iv.** The Mill: AP had received a reply from Somerset but there was still confusion over the new licence. It was agreed that the Clerk would try and arrange a Zoom meeting with Somerset (Phil Wake) to clarify the situation.
- v. Paths from Barrow Farm: The Clerk reported he had a new quote and it was agreed this should be accepted after John Rottenbury had been approached.
- **vi. Drainage:** There was no further update on work on Crooked Lane and Straight Lane.
- **vii.** Litter bin: It was agreed a new bin (approx. £70) should be purchased for the top of The Shard to replace the present bin.
- <u>7. County Councillors Report:</u> Cllr Denton had circulated a report to the Councillors. There was still no response regarding the slip road onto the A36. Possible funding for Electric Vehicle (EV) charging points might be available.
- **8. Highways issues: Street Lights Turn off:** The Clerk reported that the midnight turn off would not be done until the next financial year and a quote was to be obtained from Somerset once the new contractors start.

9. Climate Change Group: JM had circulated report to Councillors. He said that the Group was seeking a new chair; EV charging was to be investigated, but any site might have to wait until new hall is built.

10. Planning:

i) New applications:

2024/0327/HSE and /0328/LBC: Extension to outbuilding to from annex (Retrospective) – The Old Coach House, Rode Hill. It was agreed comment should be made regarding the colour of the chimney.

2024/0356/HSE and /0357/LBC: Widen gated access and conversion of 2010 outbuilding to annex accommodation – Mayfield House, High Street. No objections.

2024/0421/CLE: Application for an existing lawful development certificate for existing residential use of Slodbrook Farm including the erection of a residential dwelling house with extension and stationing of static caravan – Slodbrook Farm, Rode Common. No objections.

2023/2183/FUL: Re-consultation: Construction and operation of a photovoltaic farm with battery storage and associated infrastructure, including inverters, security cameras, fencing, access tracks and landscaping – Land south and east of Bradford Road, Rode.

Low Carbon had attended a premeeting with the Parish Council to inform on the changes that had been made to the previous application. They also answered questions from Councillors. However, the Parish Council remained concerned over the scale of the solar farm which had not really been altered, the lack of information on why this site had been selected (it appeared very limited area had been looked at) and the continued use of access to the site, particularly Monkley Lane both during construction and during operation of the solar farm. Low Carbon had made no significant changes to the application and had not answered any of the PC's previous comments.

It was therefore agreed that the PC would submit a comprehensive objection to this planning application.

Mendip Local Plan Part II – Sites and Policies update. None of the areas proposed for the 505-house shortfall were in this area and the PC agreed to support the proposals.

ii) Somerset decisions:

2023/2446/HSE: Rear two storey extension, replace house/garage roofs, removal of parapet, demolish room on south and east elevation, replace/add new windows/doors and amend existing access – Hill View House, Bradford Road. Approved.

2023/1747/LBC: Single storey rear glazed extension – Mayfield House, High Street. Approved.

11. Buses: PT said that there would be minor changes to the times of the buses through Rode from April and a new timetable would be printed and circulated. The D2 service costs an extra 6% to come through Rode but only gets 2% more income. This was putting First West under pressure to reduce the service through Rode and changes could be made to the September timetable. Another use the bus or lose it campaign would be run. A survey of bus use focusing on bus links with other buses/trains was to be conducted. Parishioners who had bus passes but could afford the £2 fare were to be encouraged to pay and not use their passes. It was also noted that some buses arrive full in Rode and residents cannot board these, this information should be gathered and First made aware.

12. Gypsy, Roma and Traveller pitches: Concerns had been made by Selwood and Berkley Parishes however it was agreed this was not currently an issue in Rode and this response would be made.

13. AGM:

It was agreed to hold the AGM on 13th May before the Parish Council meeting, starting at 7.00pm.

14. Financial matters:

Payments: The following payments were agreed:

Clerk Salary £265.31 HMRC PAYE £64.60 Rode & District Memorial Hall £135.00

14. Any other business:

- i) Conservation area: AP had spoken to Context Planning regarding both the Neighbourhood Plan and Conservation Area, this had been helpful and it should be possible to link the two conservation areas and include extra properties. Also providing no changes to the Neighbourhood Plan are made which affect residents this should be acceptable.
- **ii)** The Link: It was agreed the Parish Council would give Gill Leonard a gift in appreciation of her editing The Link for 10 years now she was standing down. An invite to the April meeting would be made.
- iii) Top of Rockabella: This had become uneven and would be investigated.

15. Date of next meeting:

The next meeting would be held in the Committee Room at the Memorial Hall on: **Monday 15th April at 7.30pm** (A pre-meeting for the PC starting at 7.00pm for Councillors only will be held to review the Rode Neighbourhood Plan)

The meeting closed at 10.30pm.




